# <u>Introduction and First Reading of a Zoning Ordinance Amendment Regarding Bed</u> & Breakfast Uses in the Single Family Zoning Districts

The Planning Commission has recommended changes to the Zoning Ordinance regarding Bed and Breakfast regulations. Such uses are currently allowed only in the Multi-Use Zoning District as a Special Land Use. The proposed amendment would also allow them as a Special Land Use in the R1-A and R1-B Zoning Districts.

Due to the unique size, character and history of many of the houses in these Districts, the belief is that they could be well suited for use as Bed and Breakfasts. They would be subject to the review standards of Section 12.7, as well as the general review standards for all Special Land Uses. In addition, they would be subject to the City's Rental Registration and Inspection Ordinance.

A public hearing was held by the Planning Commission on February 4, 2014. At that meeting, the Planning Commission passed a motion recommending that the City Commission approve the proposed amendment.
