## Messages from the Mayor

On May 22, 2009, the Macomb County Chamber of Commerce hosted the 2009 Mount Clemens State of the City address. To recap, "It was the best of times, it was the worst of times"; actually it is neither the best of times nor the worst of times, but rather a very challenging time.

It could go without saying that City Hall has not been spared from the present economic crisis. Like so many families and businesses, we have had to tighten our belts and find ways to do more with less, without compromising the quantity and quality of services to our residents and business owners.

There are several hurdles we are faced with which are a direct result of the difficult economic climate in Michigan. Our limited ability to experience growth in property tax revenue and future capital equipment and infrastructure needs are just a few of the obstacles we must tackle in the coming year. We all know that this will not be easy.

Like all communities, we are faced with a number of foreclosures and vacant properties that require regular maintenance (such as grass cutting) which is not always taking place in a timely manner by the property owner. Our Community Development Department has enacted a vacant residential structure ordinance in an effort to monitor these homes; however, we need your help. If you know of a property in your neighborhood that is vacant and in need of maintenance, please call 586.469.6818 x 2 and let us know.

During the State of the City address, we touched on several topics from redevelopment of our local buildings and our industrial and commercial investments. For example, the former Saint Joseph Hospital was purchased by Select Specialty Hospital which means the property is now on our tax roll. Select Specialty is currently working with the Michigan Historic Preservation Network to entice developers to rehabilitate the historic section of the property.

We were all sad to see Art-O-Craft, an icon of our city, close this past month. Many of us recall that they have been around at various sites throughout the city for over 50 years. Sadly, it is just another sign of our economic crisis. We want to thank the many owners over the years who gave us fond memories and unique gifts.

Although Art-O-Craft may be gone; we still have a variety of retail, coffee shops, salons, restaurants and businesses, not only in the Downtown area but throughout the city, that need our support.

As we approach the end of the 2009 fiscal year budget, the City will again end in a positive note, even though we are experiencing further reductions at the State level. Our fund balance is approximately \$3,964,000. This could not be possible without everyone: the administration, staff and City Commission, working together to assure fiscal responsibility.

This community is special and I couldn't be more confident that out of these tough times, we will come out stronger and better prepared for the future.

Please take time and read the newsletter which highlights the fun things you can do this summer in your city. Have a great summer and enjoy the many activities taking place throughout the summer months.

**Holiday Refuse Calendar**Independence Day – July 4, 2009Garbage pickup will run **on schedule** during the entire month of July.Labor Day – September 7, 2009There will be NO garbage pickup on Monday, September 7<sup>th</sup>. Delayed pickup will run beginning on Tuesday, September 8<sup>th</sup> through Saturday, September 12<sup>th</sup>. Regular garbage pickup will resume on Monday, September 14, 2009.Columbus Day – October 12, 2009Garbage pickup will run **on schedule** during the entire month of October.**Leaf Pickup Policy**

The City of Mount Clemens will enforce its leaf pickup policy again this fall. RAKING AND BLOWING LEAVES INTO THE STREET IN THE CITY OF MOUNT CLEMENS IS PROHIBITED. All leaves that do not fall into the street from the trees **MUST** be placed in 30-gallon brown waste bags or 25- to 35-gallon refuse containers.

**ABSOLUTELY NO RAKING OR BLOWING LEAVES INTO THE STREET. IF YOU HAVE A LANDSCAPING COMPANY, PLEASE MAKE SURE THAT THEY ARE AWARE OF THIS POLICY. YOUR COMPLETE COOPERATION IS APPRECIATED.**

The City will schedule a clean-up crew to come down every street at least twice during this season to pick up the leaves that have fallen from the trees. The City will not release a schedule due to the uncertain weather conditions during the Fall season.

A City contracted yard waste collection truck will operate through December 4, 2009 only. No compost or yard waste will be picked up after December 4<sup>th</sup>. This truck will pick up only properly contained and bundled yard waste.

**YARD WASTE IN PLASTIC BAGS WILL NOT BE PICKED UP.** Brush piles and yard waste must be placed in 30-gallon brown waste bags or 25- to 35-gallon refuse containers that weigh 50 pounds or less. Brush must be cut into four-foot lengths and tied in bundles. Bundles

must not weigh more than 50 pounds or be over 18" in diameter. Large logs and branches over 3" in diameter, as well as stumps or roots, will not be picked up for collection.

Place all yard waste at curbside no earlier than 6:00 PM the day before your scheduled pickup day and NO LATER THAN 7:00 AM of your scheduled pickup day.

Please remember that following City policy will not only be appreciated by the City of Mount Clemens, but also by your neighbor who has taken the time to bag their leaves.

**Sanitation FAQs**

*Q. I'm cleaning out my garage, what do I do with my old paint cans that are full of paint? Can I place them in a garbage bag and put them out at the curb on my trash day?*

A. Paint cans can be picked up by the refuse contractor as long as the paint is in a non-liquid form. Please do not put your wet paint cans in a garbage bag. The paint will splatter onto the street and all over the truck when the hauler packs the load. You can solidify paint by taking the lids off and letting the paint dry out for a few days or by mixing cat litter, oil dry, or sand in the can until it is in a solid form. Once the paint is solid, you may place the cans in a box with the lids off so the contractor can see the paint is solid. Please make sure that the box is strong enough to hold the weight of the paint cans and that the overall weight is less than 50 pounds.

**Summer Season Safety**

This is the time of the year when you will see our maintenance crew out and about working along the right-of-way and in the street. We ask that

residents and visitors alike be patient and courteous to the crew while they are working along the City streets. We are all working to make our City a better place to live, work, and visit.

**Tree Concerns & Complaints**

Residents with specific complaints or concerns regarding a street tree growing in the City's right-of-way may contact the Forestry Division at 586.469.6847.

**Lost Dogs/Cats**

Mount Clemens takes all stray animals to the Macomb County Animal Shelter. You may contact them at 586.469.5115. If an animal is licensed and wearing tags, the owner will be notified that the pet has been found.

Please be a responsible pet owner by following these City policies:

- ALL DOGS AND CATS MUST BE LICENSED by January 1<sup>st</sup> of each year. A current RABIES vaccination certificate WITH EXPIRATION DATES must be presented for either species in order to obtain a license.
- A household may have a total of four (4) dogs or cats, or a combination of both totaling 4.
- ALL DOGS OR CATS MUST WEAR LICENSE TAGS when outside a building or residence or otherwise outdoors.
- All dogs and cats shall be kept under restraint (leashed) and NOT PERMITTED TO BE AT LARGE.

DOGS AND CATS MUST BE LICENSED even if they never leave the house.

**Dogs and Cats...**

As the weather gets warmer, people and their pets will be outdoors more often. Keep your pet on a leash or in a secured area for the safety of your neighbors as well as your pets. The City does require that dogs and cats are licensed. If you need to obtain a license, they are available at the Treasurer's Office at One Crocker Boulevard with proof of current vaccinations.

There are approximately 124 acres of beautiful parks in the City of Mount Clemens available for all people to enjoy. The Parks Division maintains 12 parks, each with its own unique landscape. For more information, contact the Department of Public Services at 586.469.6847.



### Behnke Memorial Dog Park

Located within Memorial Park, this is a 1-acre park designed for dog owners to let their non-aggressive pets have some off-leash playtime. The park features a people/pet drinking fountain, bio-bag disposal and cleanup stations, faux fire hydrant, trees, benches, and a tire obstacle course.



### Clemens Park

Located on Northbound Gratiot at Park Street. The Christian Clemens Monument stands in this .7-acre shaded park which is perfect for picnics.



### Clinton River Park

Located Downtown along both riverbanks of the Clinton River, this park features large grassy areas, benches, restrooms, boat wells, a Colonial Bath House, and a gazebo.



### Dorothea-Leonore Park

Located between Dorothea and Leonore Streets, just west of North Avenue. This half-acre park contains a playground for children 2 to 12 years old. During the winter months, an outdoor ice skating rink is open from dawn until dusk.



### Lawndale Park

Located at Lawndale and Dickinson. This 1.6-acre neighborhood park features playground equipment, picnic tables, and an outdoor ice skating rink open from dawn until dusk during the winter months.

### MacArthur Park



Located on North River Road along the Clinton River, just east of the Macomb Family YMCA. This 2.1-acre park serves as an arboretum and outdoor classroom for children studying trees and plants. The park includes a jogging path as well as a boardwalk where boats can dock and people can fish.



### Memorial Park/ Ball Diamonds

Located on North Groesbeck, this is a 40.9-acre park which features eight ball diamonds, a picnic pavilion, in-line skating court, playground equipment, and a sledding hill. The Macomb Family YMCA manages the scheduling of the ball diamonds at Memorial Field. You may contact them at 586.468.1411.



### Olsen Park

Located on Harrington between Southbound Gratiot and Groesbeck, just east of Mount Clemens Regional Medical Center. Olsen Park has two lighted tennis courts, a Tot Lot, a tricycle trail, a junior baseball diamond, and picnic tables.



### Rotary Park

Located across the street from the County Court House on North Main Street. A place to relax and absorb the City's downtown streetscape, it boasts a narrow oasis of plants and flowers with benches and a fountain.



### Shadyside Park

Located off Clinton River Drive, east of Northbound Gratiot along the banks of the Clinton River. A heavily wooded, 41.6-acre park featuring a picnic pavilion, magic square with ramps for skateboarding, a double basketball court, playground equipment, horseshoe pits, baseball field, fishing facilities, and a handicapped accessible pier with a boat and canoe launch.

## Fire Safety Tip

Summer is here and it's time to enjoy the hot sun, trips to the beaches, and of course, weekend barbecues. But, it's also time to make plans for a safe summer season.



## Barbecue Safety

- Before using a grill, check the connection between the propane tank and the fuel line. Make sure the vent tubes - where the air and gas mix - are not blocked.
- Do not overfill the propane tank.
- Do not wear loose clothing while cooking at a barbecue.
- Be careful when using lighter fluid. Do not add fluid to an already lit fire because the flames can flashback up into the container and explode.
- Keep all matches and lighters away from children. Teach your children to report any loose matches or lighters to an adult immediately. Supervise children around outdoor grills.
- Dispose of hot coals properly - douse them with plenty of water, and stir them to ensure that the fire is out. Never place them in plastic, paper or wooden containers.
- Never grill/barbecue in enclosed areas - carbon monoxide could be produced.
- *Make sure everyone knows to Stop, Drop and Roll in case a piece of clothing does catch fire.* Call 911 or your local emergency number if a burn warrants serious medical attention.

## Backyard Fire Pits Safety

- Build fire pits where they will not spread, away from dry grass and leaves.
- Keep fire pits small, and don't let them get out of hand.
- Keep plenty of water and a shovel around to douse the fire when you're done. Stir it and douse it again with water.
- Never leave fire pits unattended.



## Fireworks Safety

- The best way to enjoy fireworks is to visit public fireworks displays put on by professionals who know how to safely handle fireworks.
- If you plan to use fireworks, make sure they are legal in your area.
- Never light fireworks indoors or near

dry grass.

- Always have a bucket of water and/or a fire extinguisher nearby. Know how to operate the fire extinguisher properly.
- Do not wear loose clothing while using fireworks.
- Stand several feet away from lit fireworks. If a device does not go off, do not stand over it to investigate it. Put it out with water and dispose of it.
- Always read the directions and warning labels on fireworks. If a device is not marked with the contents, directions and a warning label, do not light it.
- Supervise children around fireworks at all times.

## Medical Safety Tip

A bad sunburn can be a very painful lesson in sun safety. Sunbathers can be fooled, because sunburns don't typically show up until three to six hours after sun exposure. There are a few things that can be done to relieve the pain of a sunburn:

- Take a cool bath (not cold!) with two ounces of baking soda. (Avoid using soap on the direct burn.)
- Aloe lotion can be applied to cool and soothe the skin. (Avoid ointments or greasy lotions, which can block sweat glands and keep heat from escaping.)
- Apply 1 percent hydrocortisone cream several times a day to reduce swelling and pain.
- Anti-inflammatory pain medication, like ibuprofen, can help relieve the sunburn.
- Wear pajamas inside out when sleeping to avoid irritation from the seams.
- If skin starts to blister or the sunburn continues to get worse, seek medical attention.

Answer: (a) Firefighters spend a majority of their time continuing their education. Firefighters must keep up-to-date with new technology and are required by law to have refresher courses in order to maintain their firefighters/EMT licensure.


**Don't Want Solicitors Knocking on your Door? Sign Up for our "No-Knock" List**

**Keeping your home safe**

Whether you're home or away on vacation, make your home safe.

- Be sure your outdoor lighting illuminates all entrances to your home.
- Cut back shrubbery to discourage burglars from hiding near windows.
- Keep windows and doors locked at all times.
- Make certain your garage door is closed and locked.
- Install a peephole in your front door.
- Windows and sliding glass doors should be secured with auxiliary locks. Special door pins, available at home improvement stores, and Deadbolt locks should be used on all exterior doors.
- Never hide or store keys or tools outside.

When you're away from home for extended periods, be sure to take precautions:

- Let trusted friends and neighbors know that you'll be away.
- Make your home appear occupied. Attach timers to lights and televisions.
- Have your newspaper and mail held, or picked up by a friend or neighbor.
- Disconnect automatic garage door openers.
- Open some of the drapes or blinds on your windows.

Macomb County Sheriff's Office offers residents in its jurisdictions a free Home Watch program. Deputies will check for signs of break-in or suspicious activity.

**Summer Tax Bills**

The 2009 summer taxes are due on September 15, 2009. If you are unable to pay the entire amount due, you may make payments toward your balance at any time. If paying in person, we will issue you a receipt with your remaining balance due. After September 15<sup>th</sup>, a 4% penalty will be added to any remaining balance. This amount will not be penalized again until March 1, 2010, when it gets turned over to the Macomb County Treasurer's Office.

**Senior Tax Deferments**

If you are 62 or over before December 31, 2009, (or you are permanently disabled) and your income for the preceding calendar year did not exceed \$35,000, you are eligible to apply for a deferment of your summer property taxes. This form must be signed each year before September 15<sup>th</sup> and will give you until February 28, 2010 to pay your summer taxes without penalty. If you have any questions or wish to obtain a form by mail, please contact the Treasurer's Office at 586.469.6818 x 1.

**Is Your Summer Water Bill Hurting Your Budget?**

Since water bills are only generated every three months, you have the option of dividing your water bill into three monthly payments. The only disadvantage is that a 5% penalty will be added after the due date on any

remaining balance. FOR EXAMPLE, your water bill is \$159.72. You can pay \$53.24 before the due date, \$53.24 the 2<sup>nd</sup> month and \$58.57 (amount includes 5% penalty) the 3<sup>rd</sup> month. Your account will be paid in full before the next bill comes out. Remember, we will make every attempt to work with you on a payment schedule.

**Did You Receive a Past Due Notice?**

Please contact our office BEFORE your scheduled shut off date to make payment arrangements. You can prevent your water from being shut off by simply coming in and signing up for payment arrangements. Once we have initiated shut off, you have to pay the entire balance due by cash or money order, including a \$25 turn on fee. If you cannot make a payment towards your bill, please contact an agency for help as soon as possible. The United Way may be able to provide contact information for agencies that may assist you. Simply call 211 for help.
