Winter Snow Removal

Winter is coming...and with it snow and snowstorms!! Please help us keep our City streets clear of snow by not shoveling or blowing snow onto the streets.

Please use caution when driving in inclement weather. Salt does not react immediately under certain conditions. The lower the temperature, the longer it takes for salt to react. Also, please be friendly to the snowplow drivers and salt truck drivers. They are there trying to make the streets safe for all motorists.

Please keep in mind the Street Department will be clearing all major streets first during a snowstorm. We will, however, plow the side streets as quickly as possible once the major streets are clear.

This winter during snowstorms, please park your vehicles at an off-street location. Parking in a driveway or parking lot will be greatly appreciated. On-street parking can resume after the City has plowed the streets. Also be advised, in the downtown location, all parking meters are labeled "No Parking 2 a.m. - 7 a.m.". If you are parked there between these hours during a snowstorm, your vehicle could possibly get towed.

Whenever there is an abundance of snow accumulated or there is a possibility that snow will accumulate to extraordinary depths, the City may declare a "Snow Emergency". Local television and radio news stations will be alerted when a snow emergency has been declared and cancelled, so tune in for this information during snowstorms or excessive snow falls.

After the initial notice of a snow emergency has been declared, please remove all vehicles within six (6) hours on any major streets and/or within twelve (12) hours on local streets or alleys. Once the entire street has been cleared of snow from curb to curb and no additional snow has accumulated or is predicted to accumulate, vehicles may then resume parking on that street.

Memorial Tree Program

COMPOST/LEAF PICKUP SEASON ENDS **DECEMBER 4™**

The City of Mount Clemens will again be enforcing its leaf pickup policy this fall. RAKING AND BLOWING LEAVES INTO THE STREET IN THE CITY OF MOUNT CLEMENS IS PROHIBITED. All leaves that do not fall into the street from the trees MUST be placed in 30-gallon brown waste bags or 25- to 35-gallon refuse containers.

ABSOLUTELY NO RAKING OR BLOWING LEAVES INTO THE STREET. IF YOU HAVE A LANDSCAPING COMPANY, PLEASE MAKE SURE THAT THEY ARE AWARE OF THIS POLICY. YOUR COMPLETE COOPERATION WILL BE APPRECIATED.

The City will schedule a clean-up crew to come down every street at least twice during this season to pick up the leaves that have fallen from the trees. The City will not release a schedule due to the uncertain weather conditions during the fall season.

A City contracted yard waste collection truck will operate through December 4, 2009 only. No compost or yard waste will be picked up after December 4th. This truck will pick up only properly contained and bundled yard waste.

YARD WASTE IN PLASTIC BAGS WILL NOT **BE PICKED UP.** Brush piles and yard waste must be placed in 30-gallon brown waste bags or 25- to 35-gallon refuse containers that weigh 50 pounds or less. Brush must be cut into four-feet lengths and tied in bundles. Bundles must not weigh more than 50 pounds or be over 18" in diameter. Large logs and branches over 3" in diameter, as well as stumps or roots, will not be picked up for collection.

Dangerous Animals Ordinance

The City of Mount Clemens enacted a "Dangerous Animals" ordinance on August 13, 2009. This ordinance requires all pit bull dogs to be on a leash no longer than four (4) feet in length and held by an adult whenever the dog is outside and not in a pen or kennel as outlined in this ordinance. The dog must also be muzzled. No person shall permit a pit bull dog to be kept on a chain, rope, or other type of leash outside its kennel, pen or fence unless an adult person is in physical control of the leash. Such dogs may not be leashed to inanimate objects such as trees, posts, fences or buildings.

Effective September 13, 2009, all residents who own a pit bull dog in the City of Mount Clemens are required to post signage on their property in accordance with the ordinance.

Effective November 13, 2009, all residents who own a pit bull dog are required to register their animal with the City Clerk. Forms and additional information can be obtained by contacting the City Clerk's Office at 586,469,6818 x 3.

Effective December 13, 2009, pit bull dogs must be securely confined indoors, or if outdoors, in a securely enclosed and locked pen, kennel, or fence, which pen, kennel or fence shall be no shorter than six (6) feet in height, when not leashed as above provided. Such pen or kennel shall have secure sides and a secure top attached to the sides. All structures used to confine pit bull dogs must be locked with a key lock or combination lock when such animals are within the structure. Such kennel or pen must have a secure bottom or floor attached to the sides of the pen or the sides of the pen must be embedded in the ground no less than two (2) feet. All structures erected to house pit bull dogs must comply with all zoning and building regulations of the City. All such structures must be adequately lighted and ventilated and kept clean and in a sanitary condition.

15-Minute Window Policy

Over the past few months, Dial-A-Ride had an increase in ridership. Due to the increased volume, please allow up to an hour and half of preparation time to insure you arrive at your destination on time. Remember, Dial-A-Ride has a 15-Minute Window policy. This means that if the bus is scheduled to arrive at 10:00 AM, you should be ready to board the bus between 9:45 AM and 10:15 AM. The driver may be early or late depending on the driving conditions and the promptness of all passengers. Out of courtesy for other passengers, we do ask that you be prepared to board the bus at your scheduled time. If a passenger repeatedly holds up a route, Dial-A-Ride reserves the right to request that a personal care attendant be provided if necessary (who rides free

if the passenger has a disability) or passengers may be subject to probationary status and/or a loss of service.

Bag Policy

You may bring as many bags on the bus as you can carry on at one time. If you have too many bags; the driver may refuse to take you to your destination.

Fire Safety Tips

Kids and Fire: A Bad Match
Children are one of the highest risk
groups for deaths in residential fires. At
home, children usually play with fire lighters, matches and other ignitables in bedrooms, in closets, and under beds.
These are "secret" places where there
are a lot of things that catch fire easily.

- Children of all ages set over 35,000 fires annually.
- Every year over 400 children nine years and younger die in home fires.
- Keep matches and lighters locked up and away from children. Check under beds and in closets for burnt matches, evidence your child may be playing with matches.
- Teach your child that fire is a tool, not a toy.

Tuck Yourself in for a Safe Sleep

- Never smoke in bed.
- Replace mattresses made before the 2007 Federal Mattress Flammability Standard. Mattresses made since then are required by law to be safer.

Finally, having working smoke alarms dramatically increases your chances of surviving a fire. Place at least one smoke alarm on each level of your home and in halls outside bedrooms. And remember to practice a home escape plan frequently with your family.

Medication Safety Tips

- Review the prescription with your doctor. Make sure you understand exactly what the medication is, how often you need to take the drug and why you will be taking it.
- Keep a list of all medications and supplements you take, both prescription and over-the-counter, listing:
 - the name of the drug as it is prescribed
 - the brand name if you are receiving a generic (you can look this up easily at any search engine by typing in the generic name followed by "brand name")
 - the dosage of each medication
 - how often you take a dose and how many pills, etc., if you take more than one
 - the manufacturer

Keep in mind that if you are involved in an emergency, one of the first tasks of emergency personnel is to locate what medications you are taking. By having a current list, you can provide an immense amount of information.

- If possible, use the same pharmacy for all prescriptions. The pharmacy may catch incompatible drug combinations.
- Read all the prescribing information included with each new drug, checking for possible interactions with medications you are already taking, foods to avoid, etc.
- Notify your prescribing doctor if your pharmacy changes your prescription from brand name to generic without

his approval.

- Keep the old pill container until you receive your next refill so you can compare the drug name, manufacturer, dosage and instructions. Notify your doctor if you do not understand why something has changed.
- 7. Ideally, order refills to be available before you run out of the current supply so you can compare the actual old and new pills. This is also important because if there is any delay in getting the refill, you will still have enough pills to get through the time needed.
- 8. If a medication has changed from brand name to generic, or from one manufacturer to another, you may want to start taking the new pills while you still have a few of the old ones left. If you exhibit an allergic reaction or the new medication does not seem to have the same effect as the old one, switch back and see whether the allergic reaction disappears or the old medication works better -- then contact your prescribing doctor. (Obviously, if you have a severe reaction at any time to a medication, get help immediately.)

If you are eligible for an absentee ballot, you can also vote in the City Clerk's Office on Monday, November 2nd, from 8:00 AM Until 4:00 PM.

who do not bring picture identification to the polls, or do not possess picture identification, can vote by signing an affidavit at the precinct.

School Bus Traffic Safety Tips

School is finally back in session, and for many Macomb County students, the school day begins and ends with a trip on a school bus. "The greatest risk for these children is not riding the bus, but when they are approaching or leaving the bus," says Macomb County Sheriff Mark Hackel. Both children and adults must know and follow traffic safety rules designed to keep them safe.

Student Tips:

- Children should arrive at their bus stop at least five minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive.
- When the bus approaches, stand at least three giant steps or six feet away from the street or curb.
- Do not cross the road or enter the bus until the driver says or signals that it is okay.
- Never walk behind the bus or along side the bus where the bus driver is not able to see you.

Driver Tips:

- Drivers must approach a school bus cautiously.
- Prepare to stop when a slowing bus has its overhead yellow lights flashing.
- You must come to a complete stop at least 20 feet away from the bus when its overhead red lights are flashing.
- Be especially alert where children congregate near bus stops.

Sheriff Mark Hackel wants you to help make this a safe year for our school children. Use caution near school bus stops, school zones and always wear your safety belt.

Halloween Safety Tips

Halloween is fast approaching and it's a good time for the rest of us to think about safety. "I urge all parents to keep these few, common sense safety tips in mind this season. Let's all make sure our children stay safe this Halloween," says Macomb County Sheriff Mark A. Hackel.

Children should not eat any treats until they're back at home and mom or dad has inspected them. Parents should make sure that candy wrappers are sealed.

When little children take to the streets, the biggest threat they face is motor vehicle traffic – something for parents and drivers to keep in mind.

- For motorists, extreme caution is the rule for Halloween night.
- Expect children to run across the street, coming out of nowhere, oblivious to traffic.
- Children should be accompanied by adults when trick-or-treating.
- A responsible grown-up will be the person with a flashlight, leading the way.
- It's always best to stay close to home and to visit neighbors and friends that you know.
- Make sure children only approach homes that are well lit.
- Treats should be handed out at the door so that youngsters don't have to enter the home.
- Battery powered lights are always a safer alternative to candles inside pumpkins.
- If you decide to use candles, never leave them unattended
- · Make sure their costume fits well and check that the child can see through any mask that he or she might be wearing.


